Production: Narrative

Learn the step-by-step process of film production in this collaborative workshop! After being handed a script, you will learn how to bring one scene from preproduction to postproduction—from making a shot list and storyboard to scouting and securing locations to exploring the roles of directors, cinematographers, and lighting, sound, and crew on set. You'll also edit with Adobe Premiere Pro CC, working toward a completed scene.

You'll have full access to the Lab's camera, lighting, and sound equipment. This is the perfect opportunity to gain valuable experience, build your film reel, or work on senior projects. Designed for students with prior filmmaking experience.

- Weeks 1–4: Instruction: Classes and practice in script development and preproduction.
- Weeks 5–8: Production: Course meetings include screening dailies, further script refinement, and production support.
- Weeks 9–12: Editing: Rough cut screenings, feedback, and postproduction supervision.
