Our exciting new camp offers a fresh approach to summertime creating. With two alternating weeklong programs— Viewing & Doing and On the Set—kids will enjoy rich opportunities to learn about media from the inside out and make a short film...and they'll enjoy every minute!

VIEWING AND DOING

Each day is broken up into two exciting parts! In the first section, campers will watch a feature-length film bookended by two faculty-led discussions, each focusing on specific film techniques and concepts. In addition, campers will strengthen their analytical skills and film knowledge through short related activities.

The second section sees campers experiencing a new form of media every single day! In this 3-hour block, campers will flex their creative muscle as they are introduced to a medium (film, animation, sound design, and gaming) and complete a short project to explore that subject.

Campers will make a collaborative short film, experiencing the production process from start to finish. Get to know your fellow filmmakers while you discuss techniques and brainstorm ideas.

Script, storyboard, and cast your film before kicking off production where you'll explore the many roles a film set offers from sound engineer to actor to cinematographer.

Finally, edit your project as a group before screening it for an audience, then share you process and the stories from the set in a short Q&A.
