

# THE LAST UNICORN (92 min.) Saturdays, Nov. 4 & 11 at 11:00

The villainous King Haggard (Christopher Lee) plots to destroy all the world's unicorns. When a young unicorn (Mia Farrow) learns that she's in danger and may soon be the last of her kind, she leaves the safety of her protected forest and enlists the help of Schmendrick (Alan Arkin), a gentle, albeit clumsy, sorcerer. Together, they embark on a long and dangerous journey with one goal: to defeat Haggard and save the unicorns from extinction, 1982.

#### THE NEVERENDING STORY (94 min.) Saturdays, Nov. 18 & 25 at 11:00

A lonely young boy with a love of books is drawn into a timeless world of fabulous creatures—a world that only he can save from certain destruction—as he discovers that he is the hero of The Neverending Story. One of the most popular fantasy movies of the decade, *The NeverEnding Story* still feels as magical (and sometimes as scary and heartbreaking) as it did when it was first released. 1984.



### ANASTASIA (94 min.) ON 35MM

Saturdays, Dec. 2 & 9 at 11:00

The last surviving child (Meg Ryan) of the Russian Royal Family joins two con men to reunite with her grandmother, the Dowager Empress (Angela Lansbury), while the undead Rasputin seeks her death. One of history's stranger mysteries gets a Don Bluth fantasy treatment with charming characters, a visually stunning adventure, and an unforgettable theme song, "Once Upon a December." 1997.







## **MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS** (117 min.) Saturdays, Dec. 16 & 23 at 11:00

The classic MGM musical Meet Me in St. Louis follows four sisters (including one played by Judy Garland) as they await the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair. The girls learn about life, love, and family in the most heartwarming of ways. Garland's performance and her version of "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" helped make this vintage musical a perennial favorite for all ages. 1944.

Saturday, Feb. 10 at 11:00 followed by an art activity


